# **Pastor Paul Stjernholm**

What a year of transitions! We weathered two pastors taking new calls and continued to negotiate through the construction process!

**Staffing changes** 

The Staff at Peace is an amazing group of dedicated, creative people who bring a lot of energy and fun to the work they do! This year we hated to hear Pastor **Renae's** announcement that she was going to pursue fulltime education in chaplaincy care in the Twin Cities. She had served Peace in a variety of ways, first as an organizer of the Faith and Family Team, then as our Nursery Coordinator, then as our Director of Children's Ministries, then as a pastoral Intern, and then as one of our four pastors. Her innovative thinking and her heart for people impacted and changed how we do ministry at Peace.

Then the Holy Spirit called **Pastor Jonathan** to do critically needed work in the South Dakota Synod as the Director of Evangelical Ministry. Over the years he served Peace we leaned on him heavily to get our livestream worship ministry up and running. He also did heavy lifting for the Peace NEXT campaign that helped the congregation raise \$1.4 million for the first two years. He also served as the Construction Liaison between the Staff and the General Contractor, keeping track of dozens of details that naturally arise during any construction project. He, too, has helped forever change the ministry of During this past summer the congregation voted to Peace Lutheran.

AND, we celebrated **Jeff Panek's** retirement as our Facilities Manager. We have been so blessed by Jeff's ability to get things done, both inside and outside of the building. Besides the usual maintenance demands, Jeff completed a multi-year project to trade out every fluorescent light in the building with LED lights, which involved rewiring each of the fixtures. You would be surprised how many lights are in the building, and what huge savings this means for the church!

Fortunately, saying goodbye to friends is followed by saying hello to new friends! In the area of Facilities Maintenance, we were blessed to hire **Jordan Simon** as our Facilities Coordinator, and Jose Nevarez and Kristen Seeman, Custodial support and equally blessed to have one of our members, Dave Hatle, bring his experience to help with some of the big projects that needed to be addressed during this time of construction.

And we were blessed to call **Pastor Elizabeth Platts** to serve Peace! The congregation has already been blessed by her ministry, and it has been a joy to get to know her! Among other responsibilities, she will work closely with our Faith Formation directors as Peace expands its ministry in that area. And I am so grateful for the way Pastor Alex has partnered with me to navigate through both pastoral transitions!

And at our Annual Congregational Meeting we will vote on calling **Pastor Jason Kramme** to fill out the pastoral team. The Call Committee and the Staff who have make it fun and so rewarding to be a pastor at Peace!! met Pastor Jason are very excited to introduce him to the

congregation and look forward to the gifts and energy he will bring to Peace Lutheran!

Finally, we are thankful that Pat Grieben and **Miranda Fox** has stepped up to help our team of Worship Hosts.

### **Peace NEXT**

It's been exciting to celebrate different completions of



the PeaceNEXT project this year, starting with the Playground which we were able to start using in September. Then the Music Hub addition opened in November. And the Family Activities Center opened the first weekend in January! Already the YMCA has been hosting youth basketball games in that new facility!

expand the PeaceNEXT project to include the remodeling and expansion of the Gathering Place. That project is scheduled to be completed by Easter. That new space just off the sanctuary will be very appreciated, providing a place to connect with each other before and after worship and throughout the week (think post-pickleball game)!

### **Funding**

To date Peace members have given \$2 million dollars toward this \$8.1 million project. We have borrowed \$6.1 million from the Mission Investment Fund of the ELCA (25 years at 3.875%). Our monthly mortgage payments begin early this year and will be just over \$32,000 monthly.

When I look at those numbers, I am awed at the generosity and sense of mission of our members! That same passion is going to translate into creating life-giving ministries in all those new spaces.

### Looking ahead

In the pages ahead you will learn about all the significant ministry we did together this year, and the exciting directions we are headed in 2024! The Holy Spirit has poured out blessings in abundance upon Peace beginning with the gifts that each of you brings. But that blessing also includes a dynamic Staff, and now brand-new spaces for ministry! The changes we lived through this past year have put into place the pieces we need for doing ministry in brand new ways in 2024.

# **2023 Annual Congregational Meeting Minutes**

The meeting was called to order by President Adam Hatle on January 29, 2023 There was a quorum of 50 or more members in attendance. Some also participated through ZOOM.

A prayer was given.

The minutes of the 2022 meeting were available in the annual report. Cara Hetland moved to approve the minutes, and Amanda Painter seconded the motion. The minutes were approved.

Treasurer Jamie Dooley reviewed the 2022 treasurers report. We did not quite meet our budget goal of \$1,555,430.10 with \$1,429,514.60. The loss is not deemed a concern at this time considering the size of our budget. Staffing expenses were about \$73,000 less than planned. This was due to Pastor Alex starting a little later into the year and some reduced office staff hours. Office expenses were a little over budget with some one time expenses (call for Pastor). Building expenses were more than budgeted with some unexpected AC expenses. The rejuvenation fund can be used in an unexpected time of need. There was some discussion regarding the construction project through PeaceNEXT. We have closed on our loan and have also been using the funds that were raised for the project. Rachael Hatle moved to approve the treasurers report, and Tim Jensen seconded the motion. The report was approved by the members.

A video was viewed to highlight activities at Peace.

The nominating team presented nominees for church council positions, the endowment team, and nominating team. There are 6 council positions to fill. A ballot was distributed with the positions and nominees. They are as follows: President-Elect-Janet Schlueter, Treasurer-Jamie Dooley, Council-at-large-Amy Stensland and Tony Turgeon, Council-at-large (partial term)-Lori Ollerich, and Youth Rep-Emma Witt. The nominees ran unopposed for all positions and were declared elected to their terms with unanimous consent. The Endowment Team had two nominees for two positions. They are Craig Matson and Holly Kleinsasser. They were elected by unanimous consent. The Nominating Committee had two nominees for two positions. They are Amanda Randall and Cara Hetland. They were elected by unanimous consent.

A video was viewed regarding Christmas at Peace.

A video was viewed regarding PeaceNEXT.

Pastor Reports were given by each pastor. Their full reports are in the Annual Report.

Pastor Alex Smith highlighted her gratefulness to be called to Peace and to be a part of our staff. She encourages us to contact her with any questions, needs, or further information.

Pastor Renae Boehmer had a commitment during this time. She provided a video highlighting outreach to the neighbors with various activities and opportunities.

Pastor Jonathan Vehar spoke on unprecedented ways we have reached out and interacted with the neighbors surrounding our church. Due to rising prices of over 25% by about \$1.25 million from the first estimate, the building project needed to be revised. It was split into 2 phases. We are now in Phase 1 part A, and we are about to start Part B. Expanding of the gathering space needed to be moved to Phase 2. The Family Activity Center is part of Phase 1. He is working closely with the actual construction. He is thankful with how we came through the pandemic although we still have some areas to grow.

Senior Pastor Paul Stjernholm has been working closely with the business aspect of the PeaceNEXT building project. He is also thankful for generous giving from the congregation. He expressed thanks for the Council and Council members whose terms have ended (Carissa Dice-President and Jill Beck-Secretary). The Council selects a new 5-year goal each year. Each goal progresses for approximately 5 years. He predicts the Family Activities Center will have a significant impact on our church.

Old Business-none was suggested

New Business-Treasurer Jamie Dooley presented the 2023 budget. The proposed budget of \$1,600,371.43 is about a 3% increase from 2022. Gene Nelson moved to approve the 2023 budget. This was seconded by Duane Larson. The budget was voted on by the members and was approved.

The staff was acknowledged for their work.

Pastor Alex closed in prayer.

# Fern Swearingen Library

I am excited to report that the library is good hands, God's hands. It has been humbling and exciting to see how He is working though a multitude of different folks to accomplish great things in and through Peace Lutheran's library ministry.

A year ago, my big question was how to make the library more visible and accessible to all church members and people who use our building?

In the past 12 months, we have been empowered to take our library into cyberspace, where it can be used by anyone with internet access on their phone, tablet, laptop or desktop computer! Many hands have bar-coded, re-labeled and entered over 5,000 books into our online database so far, with at least another couple thousand to go. If patrons register, they will be able to place holds on materials and check them out Wednesday nights or Sunday mornings when someone is in the library. Also, there is a clipboard on the library desk where anyone can register and check out books and materials whether someone is at the desk or not.

Beyond that, we have added a bookcase display full of inspiring and popular books, along with a book drop for returning books near the welcome desk and future gathering area. These all have "quick checkout cards" which simply need to be filled out and put in the book return slot. We will get your information entered and you should receive an e-mail confirming your due date (always 30 days with multiple renewals possible).

The result of all the above has been an increase in people using the library and the opportunity to make a difference in people's lives through the materials we have ready and available.

I am extremely grateful to the army of volunteers for their time and assistance to make this happen, to the Scouts who have their Eagle projects planned for much needed improvements to the library, to the electricians volunteering their time and labor to our window project, to WELCA for financial assistance to upgrade the children's shelving and area rugs to brighten the space, to all who have given their Thrivent matching grants to our fund-raising efforts through Coffee Corner and book sales, and those who have donated books, furnishings and office supplies.

God has blessed this ministry through each and every one of you, thank you!

### **Endowment Team**



The Peace endowment offers a great opportunity to contribute to the present and future needs of Peace Lutheran Church. Contributions remain as principal in the endowment into perpetuity, generating interest year after year. The endowment grew over the course of the year with nearly \$8000 in new gifts. Thank you for your contributions! There has been a rebound in the financial markets, so this year the endowment principal balance ended at \$169,009. That is an increase of nearly \$14,000 from last year's ending balance of \$155,237.

The endowment's principal balance earns interest, which the endowment team uses to fund various ministries at Peace. In 2023, the endowment financially supported new library shelves, Pastor Renee's farewell dinner, camperships for youth who helped serve at the dinner, and campership gift certificates. The total amount of funding for these items was \$4,400.

Two ongoing missions of the endowment team are to seek ways to educate the congregation about planning future gifts to Peace Lutheran and to the endowment, and say thank you to those who have made donations. Along those lines, the committee has developed a video to be shown at Church services periodically, and also have the video shared on social media. We also saw a greater awareness by including the endowment fund as a giving option on the pledge cards. We are pleased with the efforts of our committee, and we have received pledges of \$32,166 for the year of 2024.

As always, all donations to the endowment are welcome whether they be a few dollars or gifts from end of life estates.

# Children's Ministry

### **Goals:**

Our programs are built around the desire to help children experience God and clearly hear God's promises to them. By hearing God's story told in a variety of ways in Sunday school and worship, engaging in hands-on activities in small groups (sometimes with like-age peers and sometimes in inter-generational groups), and building relationships with others, God's love becomes more real to children.

### 2023

We continue to have a strong children's ministry program here at Peace. We have around 340 kids that we minister to. Like last year we have been using the Narrative Lectionary which we used a few years back. We decided to come back to the Narrative Lectionary as this gives the kids more of an opportunity to connect with what they are doing in Sunday/Wednesday School, with what is happening in worship. We have separated out the third graders this year as this age group is in that in-between stage of being too big for the lower grade curriculum and not quite old enough for the upper-level curriculum. The curriculum that we are using for kindergarten through third grade this year offers an "older kid" supplement to the original lesson to allow them a little deeper thinking and a little more to the activity they do each week.

We were blessed to have had our annual Children's Christmas program. We had a little over 70 kids participate by either playing in the prelude before the program, to acting, singing and learning lots of lines. The kids start learning the songs in September and with only 2 large group rehearsals, learn the whole program. A huge thanks to Darya Levesque who is the musical director and Bob Levesque for all the sound and technical work that he does and the many volunteers it takes from set-up to managing kids to tear down.

One of the highlights each year is our annual Vacation Bible School (VBS) event that happens at the end of June. We had about 300 kids attend either in the morning or in the evening. There is nothing better than to hear them singing all together in one place sharing their love for God and doing various activities to learn more about Him and all that He does for us.

We also took part in some community outreach programs this year. Our fourth and fifth graders made tie blankets for Project Warm Up, collected quarters for Church on the Street's (COTS) Laundry with Love program, filled Christmas stockings for them along with Easter bags and then collected food items for Western Heights.

With the offering money in the Giving Jar, we have been supporting an orphan in Liberia, and provided needy families with Christmas gifts.

We are so blessed with the best families at Peace Lutheran! I can't thank you enough for your support, for the many volunteers it takes to make the program successful each week and for the best kids a program could ask for!

# Middle School-High School-Young Adult Ministry

#### CONFIRMATION

Confirmation at Peace Lutheran Church begins in sixth grade and continues into the start of tenth grade when they are invited to participate in an Affirmation of Baptism Service on Reformation Sunday. 55 students affirmed their baptism this year (between Affirmation of Baptism and other services)!

Highlights from the program this year include:

- **6**<sup>th</sup> **Grade**—Our new class of 6<sup>th</sup> grade students have been walking through the Bible with Pastor Alex. We've been encouraging creative expression in each week's lesson. The small groups are still in their forming phase and learning what it means to be in a small group together. The energy in the Fellowship Hall on Wednesday evenings is high and it is a delight to spend time with them each week. In October, they served at Kids Against Hunger and are looking forward to other service projects coming in the back half of the year.
- 7<sup>th</sup> **Grade**—Our 7<sup>th</sup> grade students are in their Small Catechism year. We continue to use project-based learning for this year. So far, they have completed their Lord's Prayer video (check it out; it's amazing!), the 10 Commandments, and are currently working on the Apostles' Creed. This small but mighty crew are quite the budding theologians!
- 8th & 9th Grade—Our 8th & 9th grade students have delved into their Living Lutheran year, where we start to help them draw connections between their faith at church and what that means out in their everyday lives. In September, Pastor Chris came from Church on the Street to do a service project with them. Up to now, they have spent a lot of time reflecting on who they are from their spiritual gifts to their enneagram type, talking about faithful stewardship, and are just delving into healthy relationships. It's been a privilege to see these students grow and to be a part of their self-discovery!
- **Life/Death Discussion** 10<sup>th</sup> graders and their parents participated in this conversation about creation/new life, life/choices/consequences and end of life/death.

### MIDDLE SCHOOL

In addition to weekly Confirmation activities, middle school students are invited to get involved in **Middle School First Fridays**. Activities this past year have included Faith Fest at Augustana University, Air Madness, photo scavenger hunt, Skate City, Corn Maze, and a Christmas movie. We have anywhere from 25-60 stu-

dents who participate in these events. These events are filled with organized chaos and plenty of fun! Thank you to all of our adult volunteers who help make our events happen and invest in our youth. We couldn't do it without you!

### HIGH SCHOOL

While some of our high school students (9th and first part of 10th grade year) are also involved in Confirmation, they are also invited to weekly **High School**Youth Group on Sunday evenings. We started **High School Second Sundays** as well! We meet regularly for games, service activities, and to talk about faith in our daily lives. I often will say that we have the best students and families, and I truly mean that. Our students are compassionate, empathetic, kind, and have deep calls to serving others. They are a blessing to this church, this community, and the world. Thank you to our regular volunteers and college students who take time each week to spend with these amazing students.

**Summer Camps** have been a staple part of the children and youth ministry here at Peace. Peace again had many campers enjoy time at Outlaw Ranch, Klein Ranch and NeSoDak. We look forward to another summer of fun and encountering God!

### YOUNG ADULTS

We have taken a bit of a hiatus as our group has shrunk. However, Tyler Egge (Holy Cross Lutheran Church) and I applied for a grant from ELCA Young Adults to create a Gather community here in Sioux Falls. There are a handful of other sites across the country of communities of young adults who gather to worship, fellowship, and support each other through this time of big change. Stay tuned for a launch date!

As we look ahead, we are eagerly anticipating the **2024 ELCA Youth Gathering** in New Orleans! We have **64** incredible students from 8th-12th grade attending and for the first time we have a youth participating in the tAble, a pre-event for youth with a wide array of disabilities. We have started meeting monthly to dive deep into the theme **Created to Be** and eat together. I cannot wait to see how this group continues to form and support each other. A huge thank you to this community for your generosity as we fundraise for the journey ahead. I am blown away by how Peace shows up and surrounds our youth with support, financially and spiritually. We have **11 adults** headed with our students. We will also be traveling with First Lutheran Church in Brookings and Shalom Lutheran Church in Harrisburg. # **Adult Ministry**

The adults who make Peace home have many different ways to connect and grow, support and care, as seen in a number of the summaries in this Annual Report. Here is a quick recap of some of those options:

Ongoing studies range from the women's circle groups Painter and LuAnn Yoder for volunteering your time and that meet on the third Thursday of each month, two book clubs that meet once a month, and Pub Theology that meets once a month summer and fall. Weekly studies include Men's Breakfast on Tuesdays, Women's Wednesday morning group, Friday Morning Bible Study and Forum that meets on Sunday mornings. In addition, during Lent we offer short term studies, this year based on the book, "Meeting Jesus at the Table," a conversation about all the ministry that happened around a gathering with food. New this year was the self-paced Confirmation program for adults, called Confirm It!, where we had three adults complete the program and confirm their faith during worship. And another new study in 2023 was based on the made-for-tv series, The Chosen, depicting the life and ministry of Jesus and those who were close to them. The first two seasons were watched and discussed, and study of the third season is underway now.

One of the adult milestones this year was the Anniversary of Marriage Milestone held in February. A nice dinner, some games and activities and words of encouragement were included in this year's event. Watch the February calendar for next year's event!

Small groups offer another way to connect. Whether it's a small group that meets to paint inspirational messages on rocks, Peaceful Stampers who make cards, Bible journaling, these groups meet around an activity and include devotions or a text study.

**Senior Ministry** at Peace includes a variety of gathering opportunities. Game day is on the first, third and fifth Thursdays of each month, and offers time for fellowship and card/dice/board games - picked by those in attendance. On the fourth Monday of each month we have Senior Potluck. During October through March, the potlucks are held at noon followed by a concert or program at 12:45 PM. In the summer, we meet at 5:30 for the potluck followed by a potluck or program. This year's list of programs included a PeaceNext update, picnic and sing-a-long at Sertoma Park, picnic and concert at McKennan Park, Short Notice concert, Driving Tips for Seniors, Veterans Community Project, Midwest Honor Flight, and Mona Hjerpe Christmas Concert. In addition, we added some additional "Seniors on the Move" activities, including concerts at McKennan Park, the Levitt, and a trip to Nora Country Store in Nora, SD.

### **Transportation**

We have been running the Senior bus for both the 9 and

10:10am services as ridership has continued to grow. We also continue picking up for Friday morning Bible Study and for other special occasions. It is always so fun to see those smiling faces when the bus rolls up. A special thanks to Brian Moncur, Ken McQuisten, Joe talents to drive. This year's **Women's Event** had the theme, "Wrapped in God's Love," and was a reminder to the women of all ages (multiple generations!) who attended of the many ways God cares for us.



# **WELCA (Women of the ELCA)**

The purpose statement for Peace Lutheran's Women's Ministries: as a community of women created in the image of God, called to discipleship in Jesus Christ, and empowered by the Holy Spirit, we commit ourselves to grow in faith, affirm our gifts, support one another in our callings, engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness, in the church, the society, and the world.

The Women of Peace Lutheran have been active in 2023 making a difference in the lives of many. The WELCA Officers for 2023 were Linda Jensen~Leader, Millie Horter~Treasurer, and Kathy Porter~Recorder.

Meetings were held on March 20, 2023 following the February Love Offering and on October 16, 2023 following the September Thank Offering. The officers and members met to discuss and vote on the distribution of benevolence gifts as following: Pueblo de Dios VBS, Peace Campers, Peace VBS, Lunch Is Served, Necessities for Neighbors, Family Connections, SOS (Supply Our Students), Peace Library, Pastor Appreciation gift cards, Boy Scouts, Veteran's Service Center, Global Missions (school lunches), Winter Clothes for School Kids, Good Samaritan Village (for haircuts), St. Dysmas, Nicaragua~Bishop Victoria Memorial Fund. A total of \$8,300 plus the use of the \$1,250 of Thrivent Grant money was used to supplemental the benevolence giving. Thank you to Kathy Porter, Diane Feller, and Beverly Philiber for utilizing their Thrivent Grant Cards. Donation tubs were available for Peace members to provide additional gifts for the School Kids, Veterans, and Good Samaritan Village.

A meeting was held on July 24, 2023 to discuss the kitchen garbage disposal and the funeral committee. It was decided to contribute \$1,000 in repairing the kitchen garbage disposal. Changes were made on the number of workers and cakes needed for funerals and a list of instructions is now posted in the kitchen. Eighteen funerals were conducted with 1,783 people served by the funeral committee and volunteers.

Both Circles met on the third Thursday of the month from September to June at church. Ruth Circle meets at 9:30 am, and Hannah Circle meets on 2:30 pm. The *Gather* magazine is used by both circles for the lessons that are discussed each month. In December, the Circles held a joint meeting at the All Day Cafe for lunch with Pastor Elizabeth leading the bible study.

The Peace Quilters met the first and second Thursday of each month plus additional times during the summer months. The Quilt group sent 161 quilts to Lutheran World Relief, gave 12 quilts to Children's Home Shelter for Family (formerly called Children's Inn), 9 quilts to Veteran's Outreach Center, and 22 quilts to Church on the Street, 8 quilts to the Furniture Mission, and 4 quilts were given to hospice facilities. The Peace Quilters raised funds through their annual lefse sales and December craft sale to purchase quilt batting, flat sheets, other quilt supplies as needed, and \$1,000 to the Peace Campers. The group sold raffle chances on 2 quilts and donated \$1,325 to PeaceNEXT.

The Peace Prayer Shawl members met on the third Tuesday of each month. The group made 196 prayer shawls in 2023. The group gave 22 prayer shawls to Good Samaritan Village; 60 prayer shawls and 190 pocket prayer shawls were given to Sanford Hospice (Ava's House). Church on the Street received 1200 pocket prayer shawls. Prayer shawls were given throughout the year to grieving families and 29 prayer shawls were distributed during the Blue Christmas Service on December 21st.

The Peaceful Stampers continue to supply Peace Lutheran with Baptismal cards and Thinking of You cards for Peace Meals.

Annual Report 2023 ChurchontheStreetsf.org

Church on the Street continues to show up with the good news of Jesus, especially where folks are experiencing homelessness and poverty. You'll find us on the streets, visiting folks in shelters, cars, hospitals, laundry mats, and jails. This year, our offices moved to 515 N. Main. Ave inside the Multi-Cultural Center and are accessible through the Minnehaha County building, so more people are stopping by since they're already in the building for other things. Skylar Allen, Director of Organization, oversees record growth in food requests, with 242 families accessing the pantry during the year's first quarter and 885 families in the fourth quarter.

Also, this year, we and several of our partners worked with Sioux Falls Thrive to get the Eat Well Sioux Falls Mobile Market into food deserts in our town. Luke Senst is the Market Manager in addition to being our Director of Media Ministries. The mobile market is one example of how partnerships and collaborations are how we help share God's love in tangible ways.

Finally, it is a blessing to be Church together, sharing the best and worst of life and leaning on the promises of our Savior. Harriet Monson, Director of Laundry with Love, said it best: "One of the best moments for me this year was when the young single mom who moved into a place with a washer and dryer (so she doesn't need our services anymore) but she came back to visit."

Thank you for all the ways you are part of Church on the Street through your prayers, financial donations, in-kind donations, visits, and sharing our story. You are a blessing!

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Grace and peace to you from God, our Father, and from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Amen!

Greeting from your sisters and brothers in Christ at St Dysmas Lutheran Church!

There is an old saying that the only constant is change; and 2023 lived up to that statement. Working inside the walls, especially in 2023, has seen some significant changes to policies, visitation requirements, and schedules. What we see as stumbling blocks, God uses to his glory. Even amidst the many challenges, God has been at work in amazing ways in the lives of people inside and outside the walls.

Firstly, thank you for your support to insure that the ministry of St Dysmas stays vibrant and active. We do not exist without the support and engagement from you. St Dysmas is YOUR ministry to those experiencing incarceration; and we are grateful for your partnership.

Here are a few highlights for this year:

- On any given day, there are approximately 3750 people incarcerated in the South Dakota Department of Corrections system. In 2023, we worked with and saw attendance of approximately 574 individuals to worship, Bible studies, and one-on-one pastoral care visits. Worship and Bible study attendance has steadily increased over the year at each site.
- We had 31 baptisms of adult men including 3 affirmations of baptism.
- · We were able to hold special worship on Easter and Christmas Eve inside the facilities.
- Our Reformation Festivals took place at both Sioux Falls and Springfield on Reformation Weekend in October.
   A special meal was served at Springfield, and inmates were allowed to share the meal with their family that could attend.
- · The annual special meal was held in Sioux Falls in August sponsored by Peace Lutheran Church in Sioux Falls.
- Worship switched to Tuesday evenings from 5:00 to 8:00 at Springfield. We have seen great participation by visitors to Springfield since this change occurred.
- Worship in Sioux Falls changed to Wednesday afternoons from 1:30 to 3:30. While this is not ideal, we have still had visitors attend very regularly.
- We have seen increasing engagement and attendance with our reentry work on the inside. Mitch Wilson worked with 244
  individuals preparing to be released from incarceration.
- Mitch accompanied 156 individuals once they were released to help them transition back into life on the outside.
- Mitch also works in the Minnehaha County jail with individuals housed there. In his work there, he met with 541 people in 2023.
- Over 3700 Christmas Treat Sacks were distributed the week before Christmas. Every person in the South Dakota Prison System
  received a sack, also people in the Minnehaha County, and Yankton County jails.
- The Sioux Falls congregation again took up the challenge to support a ministry outside of themselves. All inmate offering goes to this fund, and for 2023, they will give Church on the Street a check for \$2271.
- The Springfield congregation took up the same challenge. They will distribute their funds after the January Inside Council Meeting. They will have approximately \$750 to distribute.
- I was able to visit 46 congregations to tell the story of St Dysmas and worship together.

These are just a few of the ways God has been at work through St Dysmas. I give thanks to God for the many gifts that the has entrusted to us. Through the faithful partnership of many of you, we continue to be able to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ to this who need to hear it most; "setting the captives free..."
