# **Annual Meeting**


Sunday, January 28 | 12:30pm | Sanctuary

She hopes to help others by sharing her life and give hope and direction to individuals and families who have been caught up in criminal sex trafficking right here where we live.

# **PeaceNEXT Update**

## **Construction Nears Completion!**

After one-and-a-half years our construction is almost done. We began using the new playground in September, we moved into the Music Hub in November, the Family Activity Center (and West Entrance) opens on January 6, and the new Gathering Place expansion will be ready by mid-March! These new spaces not only look great, but they will transform the shape of ministry at Peace.

## **Amazing Generosity**

What makes all of this more amazing is that we actually squeezed in two projects when we thought we could only do one! The first project was to construct two new spaces: the Music Hub (to the north) and Family Activity Center (to the southwest). The cost of constructing these two new spaces was roughly \$6.8 million.

But as we neared the end of construction, we realized that we had raised "just about" the resources needed for the greatly-needed remodeling project that would expand the space outside the Sanctuary by adding a Gathering Place. This area will be located between the kitchen and Sanctuary and set up with tables and chairs to encourage fellowship around worship and accommodate many of our funeral lunches. The cost of that project was about \$1.3 million. All that was made possible by the congregation giving so generously on the front end of the project!

## Thank You!!

A big thank you to those who have supported this project with your prayers and generous gifts. It is amazing what becomes possible when we work together! But we're not done yet...there is a monthly mortgage starting up in February, and if everybody does a little, that will be the easiest part yet!

Be a part of what God is making possible here at Peace! And thank you again for your generosity and making possible the ministry we share!

January 6, 7, & 10 | The Baptism of Our Lord | Mark 1:4-11 After celebrating Jesus' birth, we begin the season of Epiphany by celebrating the baptism of Jesus by the prophet John, and God's word of love and blessing upon him as the savior.

This year we'll be exploring God's great story of salvation through the gospel of Mark, and the New Testament stories during this first season of Epiphany are all about Jesus' ministry of healing and restoration for the body, mind, and soul. As Jesus himself reminds us in Mark 2:17, this is great news—and not just for those who are perfect, but for those who are sick and in need of a savior. January 13, 14, & 17 | Sick! | Mark 1:29-34 Epiphany 1

Jesus heals a crowd of sick people gathered around his friend Simon's home. In our own times of illness and disease, in every kind of form that might take, Jesus offers us a word of comfort and healing.

January 20, 21, & 24 | Paraliyzed! | Mark 2:1-12

Epiphany 2

Jesus heals a paralyzed man. In the times when we feel inhibited by the hurt, fear, and injury of this world, Jesus helps us find movement, healing, and new life once again.

January 27, 28, & 31 | Captive! | Mark 5:1-20 Epiphany 3

Jesus heals a man possessed by violent demons. In the times when we feel like we are captive to powers of sin, death, and evil, Jesus helps us to discover freedom and liberation.








## Power of Prayer
