



Lenten Spa Treatment BY PASTOR PAUL STJERNHOLM

Personally, Lent has never been a season I look forward to. My attitude has been that of going to a 40-day long performance review, knowing that I was going to get "dinged" in every area of my job performance. Lent shines a light on all the reasons I need to "repent", change course, and get my act together.

But I think I might have been looking at it all wrong. Instead of a job review, what if we looked at Lent as going to a health spa. I've never been to one, but, in my mind, an ideal spa would be a place where you not only get a good massage to work out the tension that has found a place in your muscles, but also involves some exercise opportunities tailored to each person, it would have a careful diet of great-tasting food, and it would have a person to talk to and work through some of the things that have been most troubling.

In other words, it would be a place not to evaluate how badly you have been living, but a place that would help heal you and give you a new way to get through each and every day.

It's hard to believe that God is NOT interested in giving us performance reviews. God instead just wants to take what is making us sick or hurting, frustrated or sad, angry or hopeless, and heal us...one issue at a time.

If I could remember that, then my feelings about Lent would change 180 degrees! It wouldn't be about "What do I have to be more disciplined about so I can be a better Christian?" The question would be, "How do I want to be healed this Lent?" "What am I ready to be done with?"

I know we're already a couple of weeks into Lent, but what if you chose one of the negative things in your life that you want to be free from...or something positive you would like to have more energy for...and used this time in Lent like a health spa. Imagine what the next year would be like if your heart and mind found healing around that issue.

If that appeals to you, then for the remaining weeks of Lent do these two things: pray about it. Something simple like, "Lord, I'm ready to be done with this. Show me how." And say that prayer every day. And then listen. You can trust that God is going to answer your prayer.

Lent is about just spending extra time with Jesus. So, go ahead; spend some extra time with him and let him heal you. Amen.

Palm Sunday

Saturday, March 23 | 5:30pm

Sunday, March 24 | 8:00am, 9:00am (), 10:10am, & 11:15am

Today, we encounter the paradox that defines our faith: Jesus Christ is both glorified king and humiliated servant. We too are full of paradox: like Peter, though we fervently desire to follow Christ, we find ourselves afraid, denying God. We wave palms in celebration today as Christ comes into our midst. Just as the crowds welcomed Jesus into the Holy City, they grabbed the palm branches that were around them.

Maundy Thursday

Thursday, March 28 | 11:30am & 7:05pm (**69**)

This evening, our Lenten observance comes to an end and we gather with Christians around the world to celebrate the Three Days of Jesus' death and resurrection. Tonight, we remember Christ's last meal with his disciples, but the central focus is his commandment that we live out the promise embodied in this meal. As Jesus washed his disciples' feet, so we are called to give and receive love in humble service to one another. Formed into a new body in Christ through this holy meal, we are transformed by the mercy we have received and carry it into the world. Departing worship in solemn silence, we anticipate the coming days.

Good Friday

Life and death stand side by side as we enter into Good Friday. In Luke's passionate account, Jesus reveals the power and glory of God, even as he is put on trial and sentenced to death. Standing with the disciples at the foot of the cross, we pray for the whole world in the ancient bidding prayer, as Christ's death offers life to all. We gather in solemn devotion, but always with the promise that the tree around which we assemble is indeed a tree of life. We depart silently, and we anticipate the culmination of the Three Days on Easter.





Youth Gathering Update



Note from a Gathering Human

Over the last few months, we've had several team building nights to prepare for the Youth Gathering in June! These nights are something I, as a leader, continue to look forward to. Since I had the opportunity to go to the 2015 and 2018 Youth Gathering as a student, I have some expectations of what's to come. However, it has been amazing to see the excitement build for this new group of students!

During our January meeting, we did a couple activities to really engage with other students going on the trip. Our goal was to have students interact with those outside of their normal friend group. Every table got a bowl of multi-colored beads and a sheet of paper with a prompt marked for each bead color. Every student then picked three beads and went around the circle talking about those prompts. It is important for our students to feel comfortable with everyone going to the gathering as this will be an adventure for everyone. By doing this activity, we were able to build connections amongst students and adults many months in advance.

Another activity was line soccer, and although it is never our student's favorite activity, it shows so many similarities between all students. The leader will split the students into two groups and call out a theme. Something like 'all of those who go to Jefferson High School' or 'all of those who have a pet'. Every time something is true about the student, they'll run out and play soccer. The students left, who don't have a pet (for example), will be the goalies. The team that can hit the back wall of the opposite team first is the team that wins that point! Students begin to find likeness between new students and go home knowing they have someone else on their side for this big trip!

At every meeting, we also talk a little bit about what to expect, both from New Orleans and the Gathering itself. During our first meeting in November, we did New Orleans trivia to get an idea of what this thrilling new city entails. We learned things like: what the Louisiana state flag looks like and what Beignets are (a popular dessert Deacon Amanda keeps raving about). This last month's meeting centered around a video from Rev. Yehiel Curry speaking at the New Orleans Gathering in 2012. He speaks on gumbo, a famous cuisine that compiles rice, beans, chicken, vegetables, and more. Curry says, "God needs your ingredients in his gumbo". This is just one example of the life changing, eye opening, and faith moving speakers our students will have the chance to hear.

We want to thank every member of our congregation and our families, our ingredients in God's gumbo, for helping make this experience a possibility for so many of our students. Without the financial and prayerful support from all of you, this would not be possible! There will continue to be opportunities to support our youth leading all the way up to the Gathering, our on-going fundraiser is the giving envelopes in the crossroads hallway, which you can learn more about on the next page! We cannot wait to share all these adventures with you when we return, thank you all again.



March 20 | Our Homes as a Base for Mercy | Luke 7:36-50 | Lent 5 Study Jesus encounters a generous woman at the house of Simon the Pharisee. This story instructs us that following Jesus into a life of service is connected to acts of outlandish hospitality.

Called to Serve

Join us this season of Lent as we learn about serving God and our neighbors from the teachings of Jesus, our servant-king. Each week, we'll explore scripture readings from the Narrative Lectionary's gospel of Mark, in which Jesus guides us into faithful service through acts of intentionality, humility, obedience, compassion, and anticipation of God's kingdom come. We hope you'll answer the call to grow in faith and life together as servants of Christ!

March 2 & 3 | Placing God First | Mark 12:1-17 | Lent 3

Jesus stirs things up with local leaders by telling a tough parable and speaking on taxes. We are reminded that serving God and our neighbors involves honoring God first, which often challenges earthly powers and authorities.

March 9 & 10 | Loving God, Loving Others | Mark 12:28-34 | Lent 4 Jesus teaches foundational scriptures to his disciples. We are reminded that serving God and our neighbors comes from a place of trust, gratitude, and obedience in God's loving and lawful commandments.

March 16 & 17 | Keeping Eyes on the Prize | Mark 13:24-37 | Lent 5 Jesus reveals signs and signals of the incoming kingdom of God. We are reminded to that serving God and our neighbors is how we watch for, wait, and anticipate the promise of heaven come near.


