Continuing Ed in Germany!

I just got back from my trip to Germany. Thank you to the congregation, pastors, and staff for allowing me to go. What an incredible continuing education journey! I was reunited with friends that I met on a missionary trip to Tanzania five years ago. Pastor Oliver allowed me to preach in his congregation; since I do not know any German, he translated for me. His wife, Jana, took me all over Berlin and brought me to about 25 different churches. I saw a lot of Christian art and I lit a lot of candles.

One of the most difficult parts of the trip was an exhibit that was powerful, but severe. The exhibit took place in an old bunker from World War 2. It had three floors of huge posters and a guided tour that took you from the Ottoman Empire all the way through 1945. The question that it posed at the beginning was, "How could Hitler happen?" It really made me think about the importance of education and viewing all people as children of God.

The most delightful part of my trip was when we went to Wittenberg, the cradle of the Reformation. I was thrilled to be in Luther's house. My friend, Pastor Oliver, had gone to seminary there! After seeing some wonderful sculptures and exhibits there, we went down to see Castle Church, where Luther nailed the 95 Theses onto the door in 1517.

But the highlight of the trip for me was seeing Stadtkirche, where Martin Luther worshipped almost every Sunday while he was a professor at the seminary. Just to think of the powerful words and prayers that were raised within these rafters! To think of the people in the pews who heard Martin Luther preach! I wanted so badly to stand in that pulpit. Though it was roped off, I asked my friends if they would inquire of the docents if an American preacher and Luther fan-girl could stand in the pulpit. Since it was the end of the day, the people at the museum allowed me to step into that place! My friends took my picture and I will use that photo for my Christmas card this year!

Why was this so important to me to stand in that pulpit? When I think of all the theology, history, and Bible that I have read, I am reminded that it was the Reformation that allows me to do the job I am doing today.

To believe that Grace surpasses all sin and evil. To know that God's love is for the whole world. These are the things that keep me coming back to Peace every day with joy in my heart. I love my faith and I love my work. I pray that you've found even more joy in your faith this Easter season.


Meet Pastor Jason Kramme





A Care Giver's Story

As a young, single, newly trained Stephen Minister, Joel Bretscher remembers his first care receiver visit. "I whispered a prayer: 'Please God let me find something I have in common with this man to talk about,'" he recalls. Twenty something Bretscher was paired with an 82-year-old-man who was widowed 20 years earlier and stopped attending church. "I could see through the window as I approached, and he was watching BASEBALL! God gave me the icebreaker I needed."

Joel Bretscher quickly learned they had more in common. Small talk came easy, but it took time and a sudden health crisis to have deeper conversations. "He was weak and couldn't talk much when I visited. I held his hand and read psalms to him and prayed each visit. His smile conveyed his appreciation, and he squeezed my hand," said Bretscher.

To him, Stephen Ministry means growth and life and a faith that cares for others.

Joel Bretscher has been a member of the staff at Stephen Ministries St. Louis since 1995. As Program Director, he leads the Stephen Ministries writing and editing team in the development of books, videos, training materials, courses, and other resources.

Peace has an active Stephen Ministry team. Dozens of members have received care in the past seven years. If you'd like to be part of this ministry, new classes start September 12. More at peacelutheran.com/StephenMinistry.

The treadle machine provided good control for the operator and the machine Karen learned on is still in the family! (Treadle sewing machines are operated with a person's feet and no electricity is required. Sewing machine companies stopped making treadle sewing machines in the 1950's.)

She received more sewing knowledge in high school during Home Economics class. When Karen was younger, she sewed her own clothes and still has fabric from her childhood.

Karen has been involved in Peace Quilters for 9 or 10 years. She enjoys being with and getting to know the other ladies who come on the first and second Thursday of each month. Karen's favorite aspect of the quilt group is the visiting and that the quilts are given locally and internationally to people in need.

Karen enjoys all crafts, but her favorite hobby is counted cross-stitch and crocheting.

A message from Karen: "Don't be afraid to come to quilting. If you can tie your shoes, you can help with the church quilting. You know us quilters by the threaded needles in our shirts."



Cancer & Chronic Illness Workshop






